EEOC Updates

- 1. Commissioner Charge Against Harvard
 - Investigating whether Harvard may have violated Title VII by engaging in practice of disparate treatment against white, Asian, male, or straight employees or applicants
- 2. Columbia employees asked to respond to survey for Title VII investigation

Independent Contractor Guidance

- DOL's Wage and Hour Division released guidance on enforcement position of agency regarding worker classification under the FLSA
 - a) No longer applying Biden administration's rule on IC status
 - b) Enforcing 2008 fact sheet and 2019 opinion letter instead

Paid Leave Legislation

- 1. Paid Leave for More Americans Act
 - a) Creates a framework for interstate agreements that streamline benefit delivery and reduce administrative burden of state paid family and medical leave programs
 - b) Establishes a three-year pilot program at Dol to provide grants to states to establish paid family leave programs

Budget Reconciliation

- House passed their budget reconciliation bill on May 22
 - a) Includes tax provisions to limit Pell eligibility, expand endowment tax, make Sec 127 expansion benefits permanent, create workforce Pell grants, etc.
- 2. Senate will begin process soon
 - a) Changes will be made in Senate version that will need to be reconciled with the House
